OUR HISTORY |

Marietta Community Foundation was founded in 1974 as community leaders, headed by the late Carl L. Broughton, planned for Restoration '76. Upon completion of Restoration '76, Marietta Community Foundation lay relatively dormant 16 years before being reactivated in 1992 through a sizable gift from two former Marietta residents, Mary Carolyn McCoy Mildren and William E. Mildren Sr., of Vienna, West Virginia. They established a trust in memory of their late parents. Simultaneously, a new Board of Governors, headed by Chair Robert Kirkbride, was formed. In 1995, the revitalized Marietta Community Foundation received a major bequest of \$2.4 million from the late Lillian Strecker Smith. The J. Frank and Lillian S. Smith gift was unrestricted, but with a strong directive that the Foundation pay special attention to the needs of the elderly in the community, St. Mary's Catholic Parish and Marietta College. Today Marietta Community Foundation has grown to more than \$7.5 million in assets and has more than 132 funds.

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT AND CHAIR |

In the pioneer spirit, Carl Broughton brought together a group of local philanthropists who then created Marietta Community Foundation. The year was 1974 and the Foundation would play an important role in one of the most remarkable cooperative initiatives in the history of Washington County, Restoration '76.

Robert Evans was elected the first chairman of the Board of Governors and Paul Theisen was elected vice-chair. Other board members included John Burnworth, Ethel Guthrie, Charles Heckler and Dr. Deane Northrup—visionaries all.

Over the past 30 years, the Foundation has awarded grants totaling over \$7 million thanks to the generosity of our contributors, the good works of our grantees and the conscientious fiscal management and oversight of our volunteer Board of Governors.

With a record of service in which we take great pride, you might very well wonder why we did not hold a traditional anniversary celebration in 2004. After all, have you ever known (Jack) to remain silent about a positive story that says so much about the spirit of collaboration and caring for others in our county?

Doing good works with the funds entrusted to us is our first priority, thus our 30th anniversary year was noteworthy largely because we had the resources to help members of our community who were affected by the most destructive natural event in 40 years, high water.

The Foundation exists to celebrate thoughtfulness and perpetuate the pioneer spirit of lending a hand by doing good things with the gifts you so graciously place in our hands.

So celebrate we did, with new furnaces, cleaning supplies, clothing, sanitary and health services, all in keeping with our pledge to help improve the lives of real people who know we will always be there to light a candle, even though it does not come on top of a cake.

We now have the advantage of retrospection and speculation. What if our founders had just thrown up their hands at the very idea of forming a viable community foundation? What if other philanthropists like you had not lent a hand from time to time?



FUNDS



UNRESTRICTED FUNDS |

Donors place no restrictions on how these funds are to be used, giving the Foundation the greatest flexibility in making grants to address the community's most pressing needs. The Foundation offers competitive grants three times a year, enabled by generous gifts from the community. Marietta Community Foundation includes all general and memorial contributions in its portfolio of unrestricted funds.

Bret & Cari Bicoy Family Fund

Established in 2004 by an anonymous donor to provide seed money for the installation of an air conditioning system in the Fort Frye High School Auditorium. Any remaining funds will be used as an endowment to provide for the continued maintenance and future enhancements of the Auditorium.

Friends of Lower Muskingum River Fund

Established to improve the water quality and natural habitat of the Lower Muskingum River watershed and promote appropriate improved recreational and economic development within the watershed.

Harmar Mural Project Fund

Established in 1996 to finance and maintain the Harmar Mural Project.

Established to provide support for the preservation of the Kroger Wetland in Marietta, Ohio.

Marietta Band Boosters

Provides financial support for the instrumental music department in Marietta City Schools.

Marietta Day Fund

Established in 2005 in memory of C.F. Wilson to support the annual Marietta Day Celebration.

Established to celebrate and promote the historical and cultural assets of our community.

Clyde Mayle Scholarship Fund

Established through gifts made to the Foundation at Mr. Mayle's retirement to honor his work in the Warren Local School District. A scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior at Warren High School.

Project Lifesaver Fund

The Project Lifesaver Fund offers peace of mind to families of individuals living with Alzheimer's Disease and other forms of dementia by providing portable tracking devices to ensure that their loved ones are safe and secure. Project Lifesaver is a cooperative program of the Washington County Sheriff's Department and the Area Agency on Aging.

Southeastern Ohio Dental Clinic

Provides financial resources for capital and operating expenses incurred by Washington and Morgan County Southeastern Ohio Dental Clinic, which offers dental services to low income families.

The Escape of Jane Foundation

Provides financial support for community education about the Underground Railroad.

GRANT REQUESTS MUST INCLUDE:

- 1) A completed application form from the facing page
- 2) An IRS letter of 501(c)3 determination (If you have not yet been determined a tax-exempt organization, please include a copy of your application status.)
- 3) A list of board members
- 4) A one-page project budget
- 5) An organizational budget
- 6) Key staff members involved in this project and their qualifications.
- 7) A narrative description — no more than 5 pages that includes:
 - a. Statement of Purpose — What is the purpose of your project and what community issues does it address?
 - b. Project's Objectives — Describe the goals, activities and timeline of your project.
 - c. Target Population — Who will benefit from this project? Estimate the number of people to be served and the amount of services they will receive.
 - d. Collaboration — Are you collaborating with other agencies? Please indicate which one(s) and describe the collaboration efforts. Include support letter if appropriate.
 - e. Future Plans — Is this (or will it become) an ongoing project? If "yes" please describe how you will support it in the future.
 - f. Evaluation — Describe how you will assess and measure your project's success.
 - g. Background Information — Background material on your organization's history and operations.

Except to carry out the expressed purpose of a fund, the Foundation does not usually make grants to:

- provide the principal source of support to an organization or project;
- individuals;
- reduce operating deficits;
- promote a religious belief;
- provide building and renovation expenses;
- private or fraternal organizations;
- multiple-year pledge campaigns or;
- political action or advocacy initiatives.

In order for the Allocations Committee to consider a proposal, a Grant Application must be completed and signed by an authorized official of your organization.

Once an agency or organization's grant has been approved, we ask they begin work on the funded project or program within six months of the approval date.
