Jane H. Case Memorial Fund for the Marietta High School Crew Teams

Citizens Armory Preservation Society

Established to provide for the preservation and restoration of the historic Armory in downtown Marietta, Ohio.

Bill Curran Fund

Provides materials about alcohol, drug and other addictions and wellness issues for libraries at Marietta College, Washington State Community College and the Washington County Library.

Dyar Endowment Fund

Income to be used to improve and enhance, above and beyond the regular budgeted items, Christian education through Christ United Methodist Church.

Faith Bible Church Hall Missionary Fund

Established to facilitate funding a mission trip by Stacia Hall or such other person or persons, should for any reason Miss Hall be unable to fulfill the mission.

Faith Bible Church Missionary Fund

Established to assist missionaries as selected by Faith Bible Church to go to the mission field.

Faith Bible Church Rachel Hines Missionary Fund

Established in 2007 to facilitate funding a missionary trip by Rachel Hines or such other person or persons, should for any reason Miss Hines be unable to fulfill the mission.

Fort Frye High School Academic Opportunity Fund

Established in 2004 by an anonymous donor as a permanent endowment. This fund shall provide financial assistance to students in grades 7-12 who qualify for an academic extra-curricular activity but otherwise could not participate because of a demonstrated financial need.

Fort Frye High School Auditorium Fund

Established in 2004 by an anonymous donor to provide seed money for the installation of an air conditioning system in the Fort Frye High School Auditorium. Remaining funds will be used as an endowment to provide for the continued maintenance and future enhancements of the auditorium.

Friends of the Armory

Established in 2007 by the Armory Advisory Committee to provide a vehicle for funding the operation, renovation and management of the Armory Square Project.

Jean G. Graham Endowment Fund

Established in memory of Jean Graham, a talented artist, to equally support three organizations: ARTSBRIDGE, the Ohio River Chapter of the National Society of Arts and Letters and the Marietta Community Foundation for art programs or projects.

Harmar School PTO Fund

Established in 2007 to assist with various projects designed to enhance the learning and life experience for students at Harmar School.

Georgaleen Hockenberry Fund for the Washington County Historical Society Anchorage Roof Replacement Project

Created to assist the Washington County Historical Society with their Anchorage roof replacement project. The remainder of the funds will be used towards the installation of the patio.

Humane Society of the Ohio Valley Medical Fund

Established to provide resources for medical purposes of shelter animals exclusively, not to include spay/neuter expenses.

***Humane Society of the Ohio Valley New Facilities Fund**

Established in 2009 by an anonymous donor to provide seed money for the building of a new shelter facility. The fund may be used only for the purchase of property to erect an energy-efficient animal shelter or to erect said animal shelter on the present property. Any remaining funds shall be used as an endowment to provide for the continued maintenance and future enhancements of the new facility.

***Jack Louis Iams Fund**

The Jack Louis Iams Fund is a permanent endowment established through the generosity of Jack Iams to ensure the future of the historic Marietta property, The Castle.

Incredible Community Playground Fund

For instruction, maintenance and organizational needs related to the playground.

Richard P. Kremer Memorial Fund for the Benefit of St. Mary's Church

Established in 2006 from the estate of Richard P. Kremer with the principal to be held in the MCF and the net income to be distributed annually to the St. Mary's Church.

Richard P. Kremer Memorial Fund for the Benefit of St. Mary's School Foundation

Established in 2006 from the estate of Richard P. Kremer with the principal to be held in the MCF and the net income to be distributed annually to St. Mary's School Foundation.

Kroger Wetland Fund

Established to provide support for the preservation of the Kroger Wetland in Marietta, Ohio.

Marietta Area Community Tennis Association Fund

Created in 2006 to support the sport of tennis in the Marietta Area.

Marietta College Chapter of Delta Upsilon Alumni Fund

Established to cover incidental expenses at the Marietta College Chapter House.

***MCF Dominion Resources Food Pantry Fund**

The MCF Dominion Resources Food Pantry Fund was created by the Marietta Community Foundation, with assistance from the Dominion Gas Foundation, to support the Washington County Food Pantry Network.

Mid-Ohio Valley Dragon Boat Fund

Created in 2006 through the inspiration of Gretchen Feldmaier to encourage and support people living with cancer to "Awaken the Dragon" within them through the sport of dragon boat racing.

Foundation for Meigs County's Future Fund

Established in 2005 by a citizens group to promote the common good of Meigs County's future.

Noble County Community Foundation

Established in 2005 by a citizens group to promote the common good of the Noble County area.

OSU Extension Washington County Master Gardener Fund

Created in 2007 to provide funding for the Master Gardener Program.

Ken & Mary Owen Charitable Remainder Unitrust

Established to benefit the Humane Society of the Ohio Valley.

Project Lifesaver Fund

Established to provide funding for the Project Lifesaver program. Project Lifesaver is a cooperative program of the Washington County Sheriff's Department and the Area Agency on Aging to purchase portable tracking devices for patients with Alzheimers and other forms of dementia.

Washington County Partners Foundation Fund

Established in 2007 by members of the partnership to provide a vehicle for funding of partnership activities in Washington County.

River Trail Improvement Fund

Created in 2007 to support the River Trail in the Marietta Area.

Sisters of St. Joseph Fund for Caring Connection

Established as an endowment fund for the Caring Connection.

Skaters United of Marietta Fund

Established in 2005 to create a new skate park in the city of Marietta. Founders Aaron Reynolds and Alex Wilson and others seek to provide recreational skating facilities to enhance the quality of life of Marietta and surrounding area.

Roy B. & Ellen E. Snediker Charitable Fund

GRANT GUIDELINES

GRANT REQUESTS MUST INCLUDE

- 1) A completed application form (Call the office.)
- 2) An IRS letter of 501(c)3 determination
(If you have not yet been determined a tax-exempt organization, please include a copy of your application status.)
- 3) A list of board members
- 4) A one-page project budget
- 5) An organizational budget
- 6) Key staff members involved in this project and their qualifications
- 7) A narrative description — no more than 5 pages that includes:
 - a. Statement of Purpose —
What is the purpose of your project and what community issues does it address?
 - b. Project's Objectives —
Describe the goals, activities and timeline of your project.
 - c. Target Population —
Who will benefit from this project? Estimate the number of people to be served and the amount of services they will receive.
 - d. Collaboration —
Are you collaborating with other agencies? Please indicate which one(s) and describe the collaboration efforts. Include support letter if appropriate.
 - e. Future Plans —
Is this (or will it become) an ongoing project? If "yes" please describe how you will support it in the future.
 - f. Evaluation —
Describe how you will assess and measure your project's success.
 - g. Background Information —
Background material on your organization's history and operations.

Except to carry out the expressed purpose of a fund, the Foundation does not usually make grants to:

- provide the principal source of support to an organization or project;
- individuals;
- reduce operating deficits;
- promote a religious belief;
- provide building and renovation expenses;
- private or fraternal organizations;
- multiple-year pledge campaigns or;
- political action or advocacy initiatives.

PROCESS

Marietta Community Foundation reviews applications for grants three times a year. Each proposal received by the Foundation will be carefully reviewed. More detailed information may be requested by the Foundation and a meeting arranged if necessary.

In order for the Allocations Committee to consider a proposal, a Grant Application must be completed and signed by an authorized official of your organization.

Once an agency or organization's grant has been approved, we ask they begin work on the funded project or program within six months of the approval date.
